Capability

87 male and **18 female** national and county level **mediators** had additional training on dialogue, mediation, negotiation, early warning and response.

These mediators were key to quelling tensions and managing conflicts that threatened to erupt during the 2017 electioneering.

Knowledge

Service Standing Orders for the National Police Service were officially launched by the President of the Republic of Kenya in 2017, together with five curricula for police training.

800 male and **239 female officers** trained on new National Police Service standard operating procedures (**SOPs**) for VAWG, signed off by the Inspector General of Police (IG)

2,557 male and **774 female officers** trained in:

- Community policing guidelines
- Conflict early warning and early response procedures
- VAWG standard operating procedures, laws and strategies
- Reform policies
- Peacebuilding policies
